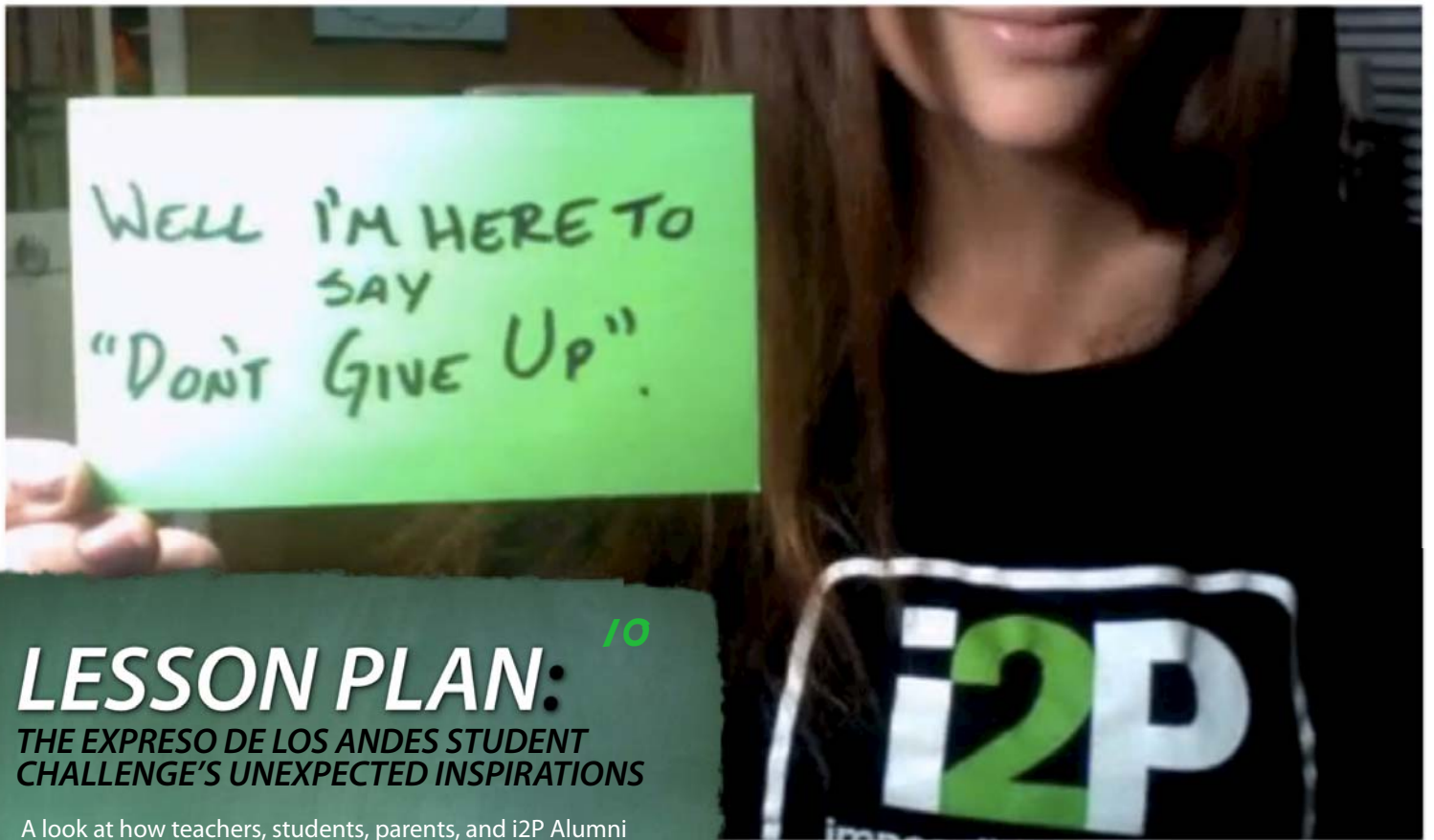

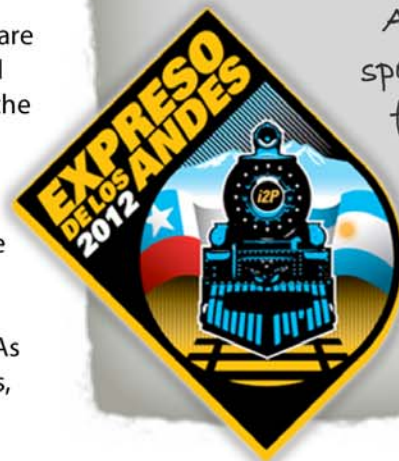

Grand To Grand Ultra

The Grand to Grand Ultra is the first ever self-supported footrace in North America. The uniqueness of the Grand to Grand Ultra and the organizers' experience and philosophy to organize an environmentally conscious and sustainable event brought i2P and Ray to sign on as partners of the event.

It is also the first ever stage footrace to start from the rim of the Grand Canyon, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. The course finishes on the summit of the Grand Staircase, one of the world's most iconic geological formations and takes participants through a desert landscape of sand dunes, red rock slot canyons, buttes, mesas and hoodoos. The course covers 257 km over 6 stages in 7 days. It is the most international ultra marathon ever staged in North America with participants from 15 countries already signed up less than four weeks after launch.

Following over a year of planning and research, including consideration of a variety of potential locations all over North America, Southern Utah was identified as the location for the inaugural event to take place from 23rd to 29th September 2012.

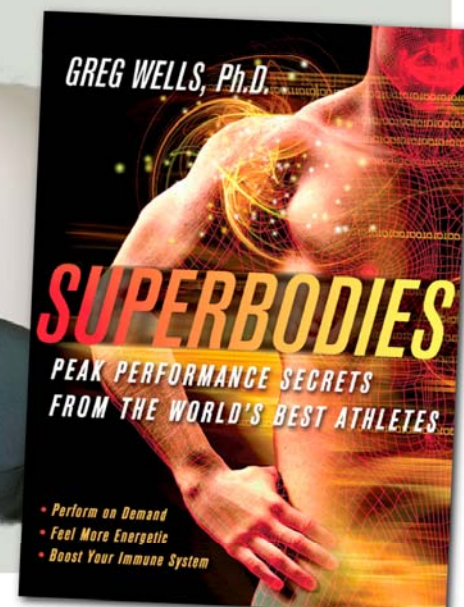
Superbodies: How the Science Behind World-Class Athletes Can Transform Your Body and Health

Editor's Note: Dr. Greg Wells has participated in 3 i2P Expeditions - contributing groundbreaking research on human physiology and endurance for the Science of the Run series. He has also just released a book - *Superbodies*, which include chapters based on several i2P luminaries: Ray Zahab, Ferg Hawke, and Hannah McKeand.

During the 2010 Olympic Games in Vancouver, Dr. Greg Wells captivated millions of viewers as the sport science and

sport medicine analyst for the CTV Olympic Broadcast. He also appeared on ABC's Evening News and 20/20. The success of the analysis was Wells' ability to explain the science of Olympic performances in a clear and understandable way that was fascinating to viewers. It is with this same philosophy that the *Superbodies* book is written.

Superbodies focuses on exploring the science of the human body in extreme athletic and medical situations and demonstrating how the reader can apply these examples to improve their personal performance and health. Dr. Wells takes the reader on a journey through the human body. He explores our genetics and DNA, the brain, muscles, lungs, heart, blood and how these systems work together to create optimal health and brilliant performances. Real-world examples from Wells' work with Olympians, Ultra-marathoners, and his research into how the body fails in chronic disease is used to show how the body performs and adapts in extreme conditions. An examination of these conditions is moderated with information on how to apply these examples to improve the health and performance of people who are faced with normal real world challenges in personal life, business, music, drama, or academics.

Two Canadian Ultramarathoners will attempt to run approximately 2,000km across South America - from Chile to Argentina, **a route that will take them directly over the Andes mountains.** Throughout the Expedition, **students all over the world will be tasked with setting and achieving their own health and fitness goals**, while Canadian Principal George Singfield - a sedentary individual with diabetes - has volunteered to train concurrently with Ray to complete a half-marathon in May 2012.

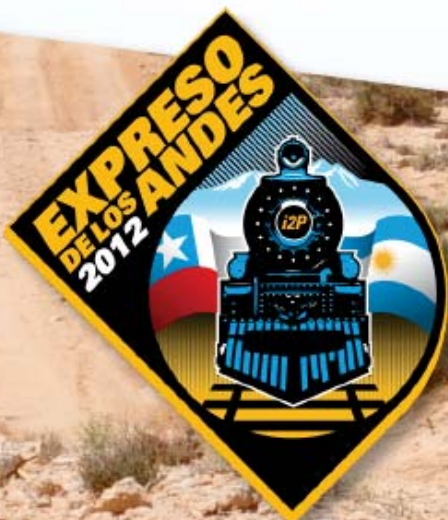
I2P MISSION & VISION

The **mission** of Impossible2Possible (I2P) is to use the platform of adventure and technology to educate, inspire, and empower the global community to reach beyond their perceived limits and make positive change in the world.

The **vision** of I2P is to cultivate a generation of leaders who, through direct experience, education and the use of groundbreaking technology, are prepared to pioneer social and environmental action throughout the world.

ESPRESO DE LOS ANDES EXPEDITION DETAILS

I2P team members Ray Zahab and Kevin Vallely are at it again! Expreso De Los Andes will mark I2P's tenth expedition and fourth In South America - with two previous Youth Expeditions in the Amazon Jungle and Bolivian Salt Flats, and one World Class Expedition in the Atacama Desert in Chile. Mountain roads, trails and open terrain will await the two Canadian ultramarathon runners **as they attempt to run approximately 2,000km (1240 miles) across South America from the Pacific to the Atlantic Ocean.** Beginning from Concón, a city along the Pacific coast of Chile, the running duo will run 70km/day towards the Andes mountain range. While running at approximately 5,000 feet, they will try to maintain this pace until dropping down to the other side, where the goal shifts to running approximately 100km/day for the remainder of the expedition, with resupply every 20-30km. Unlike some previous I2P Elite Expeditions, Ray and Kevin will not be alone. On the Expedition itself, they will be joined by Executive Director Bob Cox, world-renowned Kinesiologist Dr. Greg Wells, and two previous Youth Ambassadors who will run the final 100km non-stop towards Buenos Aires. In addition, Canadian Principal George Singfield - who has Diabetes and lives a sedentary lifestyle - and his fellow teachers will train concurrently with Ray and the team to complete a 50K race next Fall, while students from around the globe will be challenged to take on a measurable health and physical activity challenge. **This three-tiered initiative will highlight the positive benefits of health and physical activity, while encouraging people from around the globe to meet their own fitness, health, and lifestyle goals.** Along the way, Ray and Kevin will stay in touch with George and the Students and draw inspiration from their efforts to push onward in their run.



As usual, I2P will create a live and engaging experience for students and the public at-large to follow the expedition - an approach that has been called "truly groundbreaking" by Apple Distinguished Educators. **There will be an interactive website with daily updates - including video blogs, photos, experiments, and web-based Q&A's - in addition to BGAN satellite conferences**, which will allow school children to interact live with expedition team members. George, and other participating students and teachers will be asked to submit photos & videos too updating the progress of their fitness challenges and initiatives.

George's Teacher Challenge: As Ray is in South America, George will be training simultaneously for the 2012 Ottawa Half Marathon, which he'll run on behalf of Team Diabetes. Drawing inspiration from George's training, Ray will continue to keep in contact with George while in South America. Principals and teachers from around the globe are challenged to join George in his Health and Physical Activity Journey!



Student Challenge: With the commitment of their teachers, students will be empowered to take their own action! With the help of I2P Trainer John Zahab, students can download very basic conditioning and running programs to get started. Registration and information can be found under Student Challenge tab on the website with additional nutritional and fitness resources. I2P challenges students from around the globe to run, get fit and commit to a healthy and physically active 2012!

This Expedition will also act as a bridge - linking the comprehensive curriculum program from India - focused on world health - to the next I2P Youth Expedition planned for Africa in the Fall that will revolve around food security and famine.

YOUTH AMBASSADOR REPORT

RECAP: IN THEIR OWN WORDS



Impossible2Possible Expedition India was the best thing that has happened in my life till now. I would give anything to relive those 7 days where my job was to run with 3 other amazing Youth Ambassadors as well as other members of the i2P Tea,.

When I received a mail from i2P notifying that I had been chosen as a Youth Ambassador I was extremely excited. I trained hard everyday and always kept the big picture in my mind. I was so motivated that training felt easy and now when I look back, we sailed through those 7 days when we ran 270km in the Thar Desert. Before the Expedition I was not sure if I could run so much but I didn't let the number of kilometers overwhelm me. During the Expedition, I took one step at a time and never thought about the next day../and before I knew, it was all over.

The i2P team consists of a fabulous bunch of people. When we were running in the Thar Desert, time just flew by as we heard stories about Ray's crazy expeditions around the world or Ferg's Badwater race experiences. Everybody on the team had accomplished so much and had much to share with each other that I was so inspired. With time I realized that 270km is just a small number for human will. I suddenly realized that there was no limit. If I convince myself to push harder then I could keep going on forever. Today, no number of kilometers seems too big.

In January 2012, I participated in Mumbai Half-Marathon for the 5th time. This is my favorite half-marathon event in India. Due to exams and travelling I hadn't trained for the half-marathon and was really nervous that I was going to perform badly. I was so anxious that I had slept only for an hour before the race. Without proper rest and proper training I was at the start line telling myself – "I CAN DO IT." During my run I just kept pushing myself and I finished the half marathon in 98 mins, which is my best timing for that course and 2 mins better than last year. I also achieved a rank of 109 among 9,000 runners.

Now the real challenge for me is to apply the same principles in life. If I have chosen to do a certain task I have to push myself to achieve the best in it.

All the fellows who have taken up the i2P challenge – Good luck to you guys. I respect all of you simply because you have to courage to take up challenges. Remember – **THERE IS NO LIMIT FOR HUMAN WILL.**

Harshveer is a native of Ranchi, India and was the second Youth Ambassador from outside of North America ever chosen for an i2P Expedition.

South Africa. Yep, that's where it all began. My seemingly 'Jackpot'-like experience all started when former Amazon Youth Ambassador, Bridget Beury, came to my house and reminded me to apply for i2Ps upcoming trip to India. Fast forward several months to the (early) morning when I received an email stating that I was a finalist in the selection for Expedition India Youth Ambassadors. As time went on, and interviews were conducted, I was chosen as one of Expedition India's Youth Ambassadors. The feeling of excitement is indescribable, but it literally felt like I had just won the Lottery! However, the hard work was just beginning. After receiving my workout plan from John Zahab, I began vigorously training in the record high heats of our Illinois summer. Yet, my effort, time, and spot as a Youth Ambassador almost came to a screeching halt when I injured my heel racing Motocross. What are the chances? I had a deeply bruised my calcaneus bone, and, more notably, hindered my ability to put any weight on my heel. When the pain hadn't subsided by the second week I sought professional help and was told that it was going to be 6 weeks before I would probably be able to put weight on it again. 'You idiot' I thought. How could I risk getting hurt racing when I have such an amazing opportunity on the line?

Well, six weeks ended and I began training again, and was pleasantly informed that our expedition had been postponed for 6 additional weeks. I felt like I was being given a second chance. Training and school consumed my life until the day we finally left, and when we arrived in India I was extremely excited and anxious to meet everyone and finally start our journey. When we finally got shuttled out to the desert in the late night, I thought to myself 'wow, this is really happening... I am actually in the Thar Desert of India'. With only 45 minutes of sleep (I forgot to mention that I don't sleep well in tents), I was up and ready to get this show on the road! After some preliminary chats with Ray and the team, we began our 270km journey. It was finally happening. All of our training and hard work was finally being put to the test. Throughout the Expedition, the team of Youth Ambassadors each faced their own set of challenges and injuries. For me, the arches of my feet felt like they were being torn in half, but over time I was able to ignore the pain. I could write a novel about all of the challenges that we faced as a team and how we were able to overcome them...but we'll save that for another time!

The best part of the experience for me, however, was getting to interact with the students. Tired and worn out from running, the most enjoyable part of my day was getting to hold live video conferences with all of the schools following. This is another one of those 'indescribable' moments, when questions are flowing, excitement is high, and the internet connection seems to be fighting you every step of the way. Simply amazing. Every day we pushed ourselves because we knew that there were thousands of students watching our every move. When the day was tough and our bodies were in pain, the questions submitted from the students always had a way of making every drop of sweat and every ounce of pain worth it. I have traveled to some interesting parts of the world, and this single-handedly was one of the most amazing experiences I have ever had.

Fast forward to today and my 'post expedition' life hasn't necessarily gone according to plan...yet. I have only run a few times since returning, and have been turned down several times when presenting i2P's educational modules to local schools. But fear not, it has not stopped me! I continue to spread the word not only about i2P but also other organizations I am very passionate about. I am currently heading a campus wide fundraising campaign for the Invisible Children organization. I am hoping for a great outcome, and can attribute much of my passion for helping those in need to my most recent trips to Africa and India. I could write a thousand pages about my experiences on Expedition India, but I'll save you the time and sum it up here as best I can: **People, laughter, commitment, beauty, kindness, health, poverty, excitement, knowledge, fun, and simply amazing.** That's all it right there. I could delete everything above that fragmented sentence, and upon reading those 13 words, everything would come back to me. It was an opportunity of a lifetime, and I thank i2P for giving me the chance to be a part of it all!
